On October 31, 1517, a young Augustinian monk named Martin Luther posted on the doors of the Castle Church, Wittenberg, Germany, 95 theses or arguments against the sale of indulgences by the Church of his day. This touched off a long train of events which produced the historic movement known as Reformation.
