POWER FOR NEW DIRECTIONS

"As many as received Him, to them He gave power-right or privilege-to become sons of God, even to them that believe on His name" --John 1:12

Recently we saw a picture of the wind blowing all trees in one direction, so that they be all inclined that way. Yet in the woods tall trees stand upright & sway in different directions, since they are rooted & grounded. There is a tendency today to make out of power something which should direct in one way only, but we cannot thus direct the spirit of God. At a recent Unesco meeting power was discussed. The power of arms, political power, economic pressure, military power, atomic power. Then someone suggested that there might be also a religious power, a power which won't go poof", or blow up. It is this deeper power which Jesus offers to mankind in words of text.

Here we have the source of power in these words- He (God) gave power or privilege or right. All of our powers, physical, mental, moral and spiritual are given us of God. All of us receive rights or privilege from God. In a wonderful poem, which we have reproduced on our cover page, which Edw. Markham offers us. The tree has grown out of a live seed, which had power to split the earth and see the sky as Edna St. Vincent Millay, a poetess who died recently said in Renasce. The power of the moon to create the tide, which ebbs and flows and lifts the eternal sea. The insect, small yet great power to achieve its purpose. Man's thought is like a giant which explores the universe and finds great things even in tiny and small flower. Yet these powers are as nought compared to the power of Herod's Will, God, It is the power which comes from God to inspire men not only to die, but also to live for dreams and ideals. This inner power given us by the Lord God is greater than any other power which might be considered. This is expressed thru the small Church on our worship folder, which has in it the prospect of becoming great and powerful in its influence. Power comes from seeking truth and living the truth.

The purpose of all this power which God gives us is found in this phrase; "Right or privilege to become sons of God. Men can become what they were not before. There are great and hidden powers in the depths of h man personality. There

is evident a hidden continent in these human creature
God has made. Martin Luther in one of his sermons
uses this phrase to describe Christians "They are
becoming something." A Christian is never static,
he is always growing thru the power of God. We need
therefore to "live on tip-toes." The spirit of ex-
pectancy must permeate Christians. When Hannah gave
her son Samuel to God, she expected him to develop
into one who would liberate his people. Children
often balance themselves on tip-toe, they move to
rhythmic music on tiptoes. In crowds people stand
on tip-toe to see more. Christians live in spirit
of great expectancy. Be on your toes in this chang-
ing world! Jesus would not have us stagnate. We need
to be alive! On the desk of a great corporation
these words were found; "We specialize in the im-
possible." As Christians today, it seems almost im-
possible to make Christ's teachings work, but we
must put every effort. Christ is the only way out.

Power for new directions, indicated of the Lord
and offered to men, must be made real thru the
activity of responsiveness of human beings. "In accor-
as we receive, and as we believe." He gave power
as they were ready to receive, even to those who
believe. What a wonderful offer God makes to us.
He depends on us. We must be ready. The Quakers
founded by George Fox have a -form us - at least-
peculiar way of finding out God's will for them-
selves. They come together in quiet service. One
may get up and express an idea, moved by spirit of
God. They pray over the idea, talk it over. Get the
"sense of meeting." Then go out and let others dis-
cuss it. It may go a far ways. In quiet & prayerful
responsiveness, ready to hear what God has to say, one
may find out God's will for self and society, He
may "speak to our condition." The light of conscience
& the light from within may give new directions. The
light of consc. compared to green light, which means
go, the red to stop. Been put there to prevent accident
to direct traffic. By the signpost more information
is given, for it tells us what road to select of
several which are available & what will be result
of choosing. Today we follow the signpost of God's
Word, of the inner light, of Christ, so that we might
Guided into new directions.


