





For us there is no alternative but to serve God in every moment of our lives, to treat all men as brothers, to work toward the day when suffering and strife will be replaced with cooperation and love and when peace shall abide in place of war. We are not alone in this task. The strength of Christ is ours. Divine resources flow through us, and human fellowship sustains us as we give to the Church of Christ and its mission in the world.
