




New Beginnings...

BRIEF HISTORY OF

Sunday School Work and Building

United Evangelical Church organized in 1873, established its first Sunday School in 1876 in a one-story building at the corner. This was destroyed by fire in 1885. A two-story building was erected which stood until 1937 to make way for the parsonage. The Congregation began to gather funds for a new Sunday School Building in 1928. In 1932 a campaign was undertaken to raise \$44,000.00. Mr. William Single, Jr. was chairman of the Building Committee. Phillip G. Mueller and Son, were the Builders. Ground was broken on March 8, 1936, the cornerstone laid on April 19, 1936, and the building dedicated on November 8, 1936. Since the founding of the Sunday School thousands have been taught thousands of lessons from the Bible and about Christ Jesus. May we continue to use what God has given us as an opportunity for Christian Service.
