
A Searching of the Soul

4. Period of Considering Your Job. What am I trying to do in my work? Am I faithful? Do I try to be a Christian in my daily task? Read Hymn No. 261
5. Period of Testing Personal Habits. Take stock of your thoughts, words and deeds, religious habits, Church attendance, giving - Quiet Creative Prayer.
6. Period of Intercession for Others. Pray for loved ones, the Church, Pastor, Country, all nations. Take time for silence. Read Hymn No. 142 "O Sacred Head"

An intense struggle goes on in the soul. (Chapter 7)


We are led by God's Spirit. (Chapter 8)







will begin their meetings for the fall and winter months on Wednesday, October 3, starting at 4 P. M.


WEDNESDAY MEETINGS







9. What has happened to those who have done this thing in the past?
10. Christ set up four great standards to challenge men, ABSOLUTE LOVE, HONESTY, UNSELFISHNESS and PURITY.
How will my action stack up against these standards?
