TEN RULES FOR A SUCCESSFUL MARRIAGE


1. Bear and forbear..

The cross on the flag symbolizes the Christian religion, God's love for man as exemplified in Jesus' life and death, and the promise of eternal life. The blue background of the cross speaks of the faithfulness and sincerity of the Saviour, who was obedient unto death. The white portion of the flag is symbolic of purity, innocence, and peace. The white color also bears witness to the purity and sinlessness of the Founder of the Faith, and man's joy in contemplating God's initiative in redeeming the world.

WHAT IS THE WORLD COUNCIL OF CHURCHES?

The World Council of Churches is a fellowship
of 161 member churches in 48 countries which accept
our Lord Jesus Christ as God and Saviour.

WHAT HAS THE WORLD COUNCIL ACCOMPLISHED?

The World Council held its Constituting Assembly
at Amsterdam, Holland in 1948. Its member churches
have stayed together and continue to work together.
It has sent over \$21,000,000 and 25,000 tons of
clothing and food to help people and Christian
institutions through aftermath of war. It has held
a world theological conference, conducted study work
on a world-wide scale, seeking to relate Christian
truth to man's increasingly complex and bewildering
life. Conferences included an Asian Study Conference
and refugee conferences with United Nations. All
its member churches have experienced a richer,
fuller Christian fellowship.

The World Council of Churches Meets Today

The Second Assembly of the World Council of Churches opens today with a worship service in the First Methodist Church, Evanston, Illinois. Daily sessions, August 15-31, will be held on the campus of Northwestern University.

Six hundred official delegates, a like number of Accredited Visitors and Consultants invited because of special knowledge they can contribute to the deliberations, young people serving as consultants and stewards, representatives of the press, radio and television services, staff personnel and others will bring the total of those present to approximately 2,000 — in addition to which several thousand daily visitors are expected.

The World Council now includes 161 member denominations in 48 countries, our own Evangelical and Reformed Church being one of the original and most active denominations. Organized in 1948 at Amsterdam, Holland, among the World Council's notable achievements has been the sending of over \$21,000,000 and 25,000 tons of food and clothing to help people and Christian institutions through the distressing aftermath of war.

The World Council of Churches is in our times the most significant symbol and instrument of that "One Holy Catholic (or Universal Christian) Church" in which we affirm our faith as we recite The Apostles' Creed.

And We Will Be Praying Together Today


