Dear Friends:

Our stained glass windows in the Church have been restored and repaired. They look beautiful in their bright and solemn colors, all clean and shiny. They tell us the story of Christ and the Gospel. They were put into the Church by friends and members of the Church in the past and we appreciate what the forefathers did.

It was necessary to repair the windows and the work was done by the Hauser Company. We were told that it would cost about \$1200.00 to \$1500.00 for each window, if we would try to replace these today. Our Congregation decided to have the work done and authorized the Church Council to borrow the money from the Building Fund. The cost of restoration was \$3800.00. The Congregation also decided to replace that money as soon as possible.

Therefore, we are enclosing a Special Offering envelope into which we ask you to place your special gift and bring it to Church as soon as possible, if you can on this coming Sunday, March 30th, as we will have a Prayer of Rededication on this Sunday. We received our first gift for the windows from a service man, one of our young men in a country far away. If each member of the Church would be as liberal as he was we could raise the money in a hurry. You have co-operated in the past, and we know you will do your part as God has given you, at this time.

QUESTIONS PEOPLE ASK will be the general theme for a series of sermons after Easter. Such thoughts as: "What Think Ye?" "Christ and Daily Work" (Can a person be a Christian in the daily work?) - "Intermarriage" (Family Day - May 11) - "Providence or Destiny" - "Purpose and Meaning of Life."
