Dear Members and Friends of United Evangelical Church:

From another Church paper we glean the following statements about stewardship. They were published in connection with the raising of the budget for the next year. Here are some items for us To Think About."

- 1 - If I give nothing: -- I cast a ballot in favor of closing my Church. I discourage others. I am a dead member.
- 2 - If I give only to United Evangelical Church and not to Missions and Benevolences; I invite it to stop all missionary activity in this hour of the world's greatest need. I break faith with the missionaries and with my Christ.
- 3 - If I give less than last year: -- I favor curtailment of the program of my Church.
- 4 - If I give grudgingly and of necessity: -- I shall find no joy in giving.
- 5 - If I give in a niggardly fashion: -- I will become narrow and sordid.
- 6 - If I give less than one-tenth of my income: -- I do less than was done by the poorest of the Jews, Seventh Day Adventist and Mormons.

Our ENVELOPES for the YEAR 1954 will be ready for distribution by Sunday, December 13. Get your set then and save a great deal of extra work. Our budget for the Church is still about \$14,000.00 and we need the support of all members. We should get at least \$2,000.00 for Missions and benevolences. You also are asked to continue to give toward the Building Fund. Even though we have \$100,000.00 on hand now, we need much more.
