Our Church must be:

A Teaching Church

We need a Reaching, Teaching and Preaching emphasis. Through our services we minister. Our attendance at Holy Communion increased through monthly emphasis. We had 3900 communicants the past year.

A Comforting Church

We have been speaking words of comfort at the largest number of funerals.

A Hoping Church

We have tried to speak the word of hope through the Risen Christ.

An Unyielding Church

We need to be unyielding in upholding the Gospel in application to life.

A Redeeming Church

All of our efforts must tend to lead us back to God.

A Changing Church

In a changing world and neighborhood the Church adapts the Gospel to needs.

A Helping Church

We want to be helpful to the suffering, needy and in fellowship.

A Thinking Church

Bible and Mission study are vital and we need both.

An Outreaching Church (Your Pastor reached out through over 2000 calls).

Reach out into the Community and into larger Kingdom work.

A Doing Church

Our Council, organizations and various workers are thanked.

An Awakening Church

We need to be alert to God's spirit and to needs of others.

A Yearning Church

We are anxious to fulfill our Mission as a Church and to honor and glorify God.
