PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Return of the Endeavor!

The title to my article sounds like an adventure movie. That is probably a good way to describe the time since I last wrote to you, to use the old Navy recruiting slogan, "it's not just a job, it's an adventure." Over the summer I have been busy acquainting myself with the history of United, and some of that history lies within each of you. So if I have not met you yet, I hope to soon. In the midst of learning about our history, I have been exposed to many rich memories of United. Much is written of the many celebrations that surrounded new buildings and new ministers, as the church stepped out in faith believing that a party was appropriate for what God was going to do through these new endeavors.

As with anything that is new, there is a period of adjustment, a getting used to how things are different from the previous. These new eras always bring change, but change needs to have a purpose. Change for change sake, is not necessarily a good thing. Hence, we are re-establishing the newsletter as The United Endeavor. I have not found any reason, or purpose, for us to have wandered away from this rich part of our history. At the same time, some changes in the Christian Education program at United are needed to help re-establish the prominence that Sunday School has always held in our faith community.

One thing that will be new starting on our Rally Day September 8th is that Sunday school will begin at 9:30 a.m., instead of the long-standing 9:00 a.m. start. The purpose for this change is to increase the children's exposure to worship, which is an important part of their Christian Education. With this change in place, it will no longer be necessary to change our worship time from 8:00 a.m. to 7:45 a.m. in order to accommodate for communion on the first Sunday of the month.

Therefore, the Council has voted to establish our worship times to be at 8:00 a.m. and at 10:30 a.m. every week starting in October.

Whew! With all this newness, it truly does feel like a whirlwind adventure. I hope you are as excited as I am as we embark together upon the journey that God is laying out before us. In a time of change, uncertainty can get the best of us, so I leave you with reassurance from our Lord that we do not journey alone, "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."



His friends at United Evangelical Church had a great influence in his life, as he learned to live with God and accept Jesus Christ into his life.




