On motion by Mr. Getz & seconded by Mr. Waters, same was granted. Mr. Zimmerman also asked permission to place a piano in the church for childrens day services. By unanimous vote of members present request was granted.

Mr. Getz, chairman of the calendar committee called <sup>to</sup> the attention of the Board the fact that the telephone & electric bills of the school hall were entirely too high, and ask the Board to grant him permission to place a bulletin in the hall ~~at~~ making 10.<sup>30</sup> P.M. the zero hour for keeping the hall open unless by special permission of the committee any organization shall have received permission to remain later. The Board unanimously granted Mr. Getz his request.
