




Lent also brings the Coffee Hours after the services and the weekly Bake Sale.





A LITANY OF LENT

Leader: Let us remember Christ Jesus, the One whom we call Lord of Life, how He 'emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men; and being found in human form, He humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross.'

People: Yes, Lord, may our remembrance of Your suffering and death for us enable us in our living of the faith.

Leader: Let us remember that Jesus Christ said, 'Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air.... And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field.....even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.'

People: Yes, Lord, may our following of Your teachings bring forth greater faith in our lives.

Leader: Let us remember that Paul said unto us, 'There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.' Let us pray -

People: Almighty and most merciful Father, sometimes we are as aimless as lost sheep. Sometimes we are rebellious as untamed ani-

mals. We are either too smug in our opinion of ourselves or we give in too much to our dark moods of despair. We offend thy holy laws. 
SUMMER ORDER OF SERVICE BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY


