


BREAKS GROUND FOR NEW EDIFICE



Sunday, March 8, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon is the time set for the mammoth ground breaking celebration by the United Evangelical Church, East Avenue and Dillon Street. Ground will be broken in order to begin the erection of a large new Sunday School Hall and Parsonage. All the members and friends of United Church are most cordially invited to attend the ground breaking ceremony. Rev. Paul Schmidt, pastor of Huber Memorial Church is to be the principle speaker at the ceremony.

United Church which is known as East Baltimore's largest Protestant Church was founded in 1873. During the sixty-three years of its ex-

istence the membership's constant growth necessitated the enlargement of the church buildings several times. On one such occasion a towering steeple was erected in which was placed a large clock, which since has been replaced by a large modern illuminated clock. This clock now serves as the time piece of Southeast Baltimore and its illuminated dial has become a landmark to the ships entering Baltimore's harbor. Now sixty-three years later, United Church again finds it necessary to enlarge and expand its buildings and facilities in order to take care of its ever increasing membership.

The building committee is now sponsoring the sale of bricks. They

feel that everyone will want to feel that they have helped to make the new buildings possible, therefore, the committee is selling at 2 cents each—the 500,000 bricks that are going into the new structures. Every person buying one or more bricks will receive in recognition thereof, a beautifully engraved certificate showing the number of bricks they bought. These certificates are suitable for framing and should be preserved by everyone.

The present pastor of United Church is the Rev. Titus Lehmann. The construction work is being carried out under the supervision of Mr. William Single, Jr., Vice-President and chairman of the building committee.
