Completed Buildings Will Represent A Great Expenditure

A most cordial invitation is issued to the members of all neighboring churches to attend the ground breaking ceremony of United Evangelical Church, East Avenue and Dillon Street. United Church, which is Southeast Baltimore's oldest and largest Protestant Church will break ground on Sunday, Marth 8, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, in order to begin construction of a large new modern Sunday School Hall and Parsonage. Moving pictures are to be taken of the affair so that the members of the church in future years may have a picture story of the erection of the new buildings.

Rev. Paul Schmidt To Speak

The Rev. Paul Schmidt, Pastor of Huber Memorial Church is to be the principal speaker at the ceremony. The ground will be broken jointly by the Pastor, Rev. Titus Lehmann, the President, Mr. George Trautner and the Building Committee Chairman, Mr. William Single, Jr.

When fully completed and equipped the new buildings will represent an expenditure of approximately \$75,000.

The building committee at the present time is sponsoring a sale of bricks — whereby interested members and friends of United Church may purchase bricks at the nominal cost of two cents each. It has been estimated that 500,000 bricks will be needed in the construction of the buildings. Every person paying for one or more bricks will receive in recognition thereof, a beautifully engraved certificate setting forth the number of bricks that person bought.
