Dr. Alvin R. Keppel, Executive Secretary of the Board of Christian Education of the Evangelical and Reformed Church, Philadelphia, is to be the main speaker at this service. Dr. Ross Sanderson of the Baltimore Council of Religious Education is to bring a greeting.

On this same evening a German observance of the occasion will be entered into with Dr. Fritz Evers of Zion Lutheran Church at the Plaza as speaker and songs by "Young Men's Chorus" of German singers.

The new Sunday School Hall was designed by Mr. Robertson N. Randle as architect and built by Mr. G. P. Muller and Son, contractors, with Dr. H. Tralle of New York as consulting architect. Mr. Wm. Single, Jr., has been chairman of the Building committee during the building process.

It is an educational type building, with a tendency toward the Gothic, built of red brick, layed in colonial fashion, with cast-stone trimmings. An open Bible and uplifted cross are at the top coping. The auditorium on the ground floor is finished with fire panels and has clubroom effect. A large modern stage, with dressing rooms is found here.

Friends Welcome

The first floor has a modern kitchen, a fellowship hall and a class room. The second floor includes besides a large room for a department of the Sunday school, class rooms and the church office. The third floor houses two departments of the Sunday school. A modern heating plant for hall and church has been placed under the church.

Friends are invited to inspect the new building and during the week ushers will be available to show you about. The annual Oyster Supper is to be held in the new hall on November 17, 18, 19.
