REPORT ON WORK WITH YOUTH GROUP DURING 1972:

At the present time we have two youth groups at our church -- the older group - ages 13/18 - meets every other Sunday from 2 - 5 P.M.

During this past year this group has held business meetings here at the hall, has gone roller skating, ice skating, bowling. They also had a Sunday afternoon picnic/cook-out at Double Rock Park off Harford Road. We had 26 young people with us and approximately 8 adults who helped furnish transportation for our youth and also spent the afternoon with us. a

In May, the group had planned a car wash for Saturday -- and we had about 8 young people to show up and help. This meant some of the adults gave a helping hand at washing cars - and, a special "Thank You" to Pastor and Mrs. Rasche who, likewise, gave of their time to help us.
