Where are we going, again?

We will be staying in a lodge at place called **The Morgan Scott Project** in a tiny town called Deer Lodge in Tennessee about an hour away from Knoxville. (See Map.)

What is this place?

It is lodging for mission trippers like ourselves who want to come and spend time helping the Morgan Scott Project with their mission to help the poor in that area of Appalachia.

The Morgan Scott Project also runs a thrift store (mainly clothes) and has a well established mission cooperation with many area churches to help families have a good Christmas every year (supplying food, toys, clothes to the desperately poor). They also are able to give a small number of energy assistance grants to help people with their gas bills (for example). They organize The Good Earth Program which helps farmers to establish sustainable farming practices. The bulk of what the Project provides is help with making people's homes safe and usable. This is called the Housing Rehabilitation Program. And this is where the St. John's Youth (and friends) comes in (keep reading).

What will we be doing there?

By day we will be working really hard at a variety of tasks including minor repairs in peoples' homes, cleaning and painting, hauling debris, weeding and sweeping, and providing our assistance with any number of larger tasks like roof repair, building ramps for wheelchairs, installing out houses (ok, I made that last one up.)

In the evenings we will be doing a number of things to help us better understand the plight of Appalachia. One night we will host a **local historian**, Mrs. Maggie Barger, who will enlighten us about how people got to this part of the world, what they have been doing and what keeps them there. On another night we will enjoy a visit from Mr. Coy Shannon, a **bluegrass** musician, who will show us some instruments and talk to us about local music. If we are lucky, we may be able to go enjoy a sort of a jam session with Mr. Shannon and friends that they call, "Pickin' and Grinnin'." On Wednesday night we have been invited by

the Southern Baptist church to come for dinner, Youth Group and worship at their church. This year we hope to worship with a local UCC church on that first Sunday after we arrive.

Why are we doing this?

God called us to serve one another in love. We were told to take care of the widow, the stranger and the orphan. We are encouraged by our church to have compassion. And so we take this journey to give of our time and our efforts for the sake of Jesus Christ. As it happens, the people we will meet, work with, have fun with and who will serve us are also called to reach out to us for the sake of Jesus Christ. We are doing this to place ourselves in the position of being both God's hands and of receiving the living Word. All of this will make more sense by the time we are driving back. Suffice to say: we simply want to help others as a way of thanking God for all God is doing in our lives right now.

When Are We Leaving?

Saturday August 1 at 6:30 am we will all congregate here at the church, pack our van/cars and then have a brief service of prayer and anointing, commissioning all missionaries and giving families and friends a last chance to hug us before we depart.

When Are We Coming Back?

Saturday, August 8, in the late afternoon we will arrive back at the church. We promise to call all our "rides" a couple of hours before we get to St. John's to alert them of a more exact ETA.

Then What?

Sunday August 9 – everyone who was on the mission trip is EXPECTED to be in church at the 9:45 service to give our "Report to the Congregation" which should be brief. The Scribes in our group will also be turning over their travel journals for the church office to use excerpts from for the Tydings Newsletter in September and October.

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
