This meeting will be on Jan. 26th and is to be a very important meeting, for we will be looking 'in depth' at the purpose of our Council.






## CONFIRMATION REFRESHER GROUP MEETS TODAY


Daily Vacation Bible School Closing Night on this Thursday at 7 p.m. in Friendship Hall
