



2. If possible, send a card to the Pastor from your vacation spot. He will be happy to hear from you. And, go to church there.





hindered, and I am a man of my word.



Two messages from Pastor and Mrs. Rasche vacationing in Europe.

France, Sept. 7, 1964

Dear Friends:

Here we are in Paris, having left Brussels, Belgium this morning and arriving here at 4:30 p.m. All day long rode through the World War I battlefields now completely again in farm lands. France seems much poorer than either Germany, Holland or Belgium. People out here in rural areas seem like peasants and the property is much less kept up.

Really having fun changing our money in each country, all of different value. Hard to get used to. Could get along good with language in Germany and Netherland but don't know a word of French. Will visit the Eiffel Tower and Arch de Triumph tomorrow. Had a pleasant experience going up North Sea and Zuider Zee in Holland.

Switzerland, Sept. 14, 1964

Zurich is really the birthplace of Protestantism as far as we Evangelical folk are concerned for it was here Ulrich Zwingli, the Roman Catholic priest in charge of the big cathedral here began the movement which brought the break from Catholicism as far as Switzerland and the beginning of the Reformed movement. We attended this church yesterday and it was a thrill. Saw the very room in which Zwingli met with the laymen and from which he went forth to proclaim the Protestant doctrine. Also saw the wooden Communion set which was used by these early Protestants - the bread plates and the chalice from which they drank the wine.

Switzerland is a beautiful country, all so clean and the people so fine. We had a tour of Zurich, the important city of this country, one of the banking centers of the world, for there are many international banks here.

We are continuing to have a marvelous experience every day of the trip. We go into the mountains from here to see the Alps. Regards to all.
