

UNITED CHURCH FORUM THIS EVENING

One of the important documents of the Reformed branch of Protestantism is celebrating its 400th anniversary. This is the Heidelberg Catechism (the catechism which is the one used in the Reformed side of our Evangelical and Reformed Church) and is the counterpart of our own Evangelical catechism, and much older. The Forum of our United Church of Christ this evening will concern itself with the importance of this piece of doctrinal teachings. The meeting will feature the Rev. Dr. Theodore Trost of Lancaster, Pa. and will be at our Faith and St. Mark's Church at 4839 Hazelwood Ave. May we know this meeting is for us and we are cordially urged to be in attendance. Discussion always follows the presentation by the guest speaker.

NEW UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST BEING BORN

The first attempt to bring into organization here in Baltimore of a Negro United Church of Christ (brought about from the petition of a Negro group of folk, many of whom have come from the C. C. Churches of Washington, etc.) will be furthered this afternoon at our St. Luke's Church, Fayette and Cary at 2 p.m. this afternoon. St. Lukes is being the host church for this organizational meeting of the group, now known as the Northwest

United Church of Christ, without any definite church name as of this date. The Rev. Ted Ledbetter, one of our outstanding Negro ministers of the Washington area will be the speaker, and his wonderful choir of some 40 to 50 voices will sing. This will be a great experience, and you are definitely invited to be present, to give this new group a good backing as they begin their new venture and further, to hear a wonderful message and a splendid choir.
