

Those who are members of a Christian Church, who sincerely believe in its world mission, who are professionally competent, and who are in excellent health are invited to volunteer for some of the special opportunities the church offers.

Career or special term opportunities are available. The special term is of limited duration, is usually limited to English speaking situations, and normally involves single persons. Experienced teachers who are willing to pay their own travel costs may be given one year appointments.

If you are a Christian educator, doctor, nurse, social worker, other specialists, a vocation of self-filling service awaits you overseas:

Future world leaders in overseas lands need adequate schools and trained teachers. Elementary, secondary and college teachers are needed in a variety of subjects. These openings carry with them the opportunity to live out one's faith and invest one's life where the needs are greatest.

The world of medical work carried on by missionary doctors and nurses cannot be measured. Professional skill used in the spirit of Christ can bring healing ministries to areas of desperate need. In some medical centers, in a variety of hospital situations, and in certain frontier areas qualified medical personnel are urgently needed.

Opportunities of social workers, business managers, accountants, etc. are great needs also.




## UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST FORUM NEXT SUNDAY


He bestows upon us his Holy Spirit, creating and renewing the Church of Jesus Christ, binding in covenant faithful people of all ages, tongues and races.
