



Our young Mother's Club, which has decided to meet through the summer, will have its August meeting this Thursday at 1:30 p.m. in Friendship Hall.


CHRISTIAN FLAG

The Difference It Makes

EASTER altered you and your world. It did so for the two men who had a chance encounter with the Risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus after that first Easter. Easter had fixed forever who is the Ruler of this world and of all worlds. Whether or not you let it make any difference to you personally, Easter established a King and a Kingdom. And in the long stretch, it will make a difference to you too. You do not escape a new king by ignoring him.

Adam lost God and Cain lost his brother. This is the grim outcome of disobedience. Man who was created for a three-way fellowship with God and his brother was separate and alone in the tomb of his own self-centeredness.

The Easter resurrection changed this. Man no longer was doomed to his cell. The stone was rolled away. Man could walk out with his risen Lord to find his heavenly Father and his earthly brother again.

Nothing is as important for our world as this. Sin always separates because it drives man away from God into a narrow cell of fear, suspicion and greed. Christ always reunites because He alone can shatter the walls and free men into the open field with God and his brother again.

We need this reunion everywhere—among nations with their fierce loyalties and cherished traditions, among people the world over who live lonely and fearful, within our very congregation where we confess that we are a communion of saints but forget the sorrows and joys of our neighbor.

Easter changed everything. On this Sunday after Easter, it can change you, too!







INTERNATIONAL MISSION NEW NOTES

Tibetan Refugees

They have tragic stories of their escape from Chinese Communists. Here is but one sample: One young lad, Losen Sharaf of Chang, Tibet, was a student at the local school when the Chinese Communists broke in and killed their teachers with swords and threatened the students with the same treatment if they did not accept the Communist doctrine. In the ensuing confusion, Losen Sharaf managed to escape and he later joined the Dalai Lama's party. This group was frequently attacked and many were killed enroute, but he was one of the lucky ones to reach India, and he considers himself especially fortunate in being sent to a Christian Sanatorium, Madar, for treatment.

An Eye Camp

An "eye camp" has been brought to a successful close in India. During 4 days, 600 eye operations were performed by a team of surgeons.


MEMBERSHIP GROUP ORGANIZING
