

THIRD GENERAL SYNOD OF  
UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST.

At Philadelphia, Pa. on July 4 the merger of the Evangelical and Reformed; and the Congregational - Christian Churches into United Church of Christ became a living reality. Thirty three out of thirty four Synods of the E. & R.; and 3600 congregations out of about 4000 had voted in favor. A fine spirit prevailed at the sessions. The devotions conducted by Rev. Abraham Akaka, of Hawaii, were of inspiring nature, as was the communion service of over 700 delegates and representative from north and south, east and west. While we maintain our own independence as a local Church, we also are obligated to be a part of the larger work. Our contributions in the red side of the envelopes will help enlarge the Overseas ministries and Homeland Ministries, as well as the Seminaries and all other phases of work. Let us do our share. In Church World service the work is very challenging and there is much need all over and help must be given.




HOW WONDERFUL IS YOUR CREATION, O GOD



# Jesus Christ


**M**EN MAY FAIL, even the noble and the great, for all have feet of clay. The Church may fail, for it is made up of men who are weak. The wonder is that despite its shortcomings, the Church has been a means of blessing during two thousand years. The secret is that in its weakness it has always had a strong Lord.

The chief errand of Jesus Christ, when He came to earth, was not to make men strong and good. His great reason for coming was to atone for their sins and to provide them forgiveness. Receiving forgiveness, men's hearts were opened to new power. But evil is stubborn, and even the best of men continue to be beguiled by its power. Until the end of life, every man will need daily the forgiveness of Christ.

It is the glory of the Church that within it men may find the forgiving Christ, the One who alone is strong and good.

Nor does He ever withdraw. There have been times in the history of the Church when His message of salvation has been muffled and even distorted. The words of men have replaced the Word of God. The Church has then failed, but He never fails. Even in those dark hours, when the indifference of men's lives and the errors of men's teaching have obscured the glory of the Savior, Christ has still broken through. In each generation the Church has been a place where men are captured by Jesus Christ.

You may not understand the language of its scholars nor may you be inspired by the lives of its members. But the Church is Christ's, and through His Word He invades the hearts of men to be their Savior and their Lord.

# When Summer Is Done


