will have its first meeting of 1960 on Tuesday at 8:00 P. M. If you have any business, to bring before them, notify one of the Council members.




### FATHER - SON BANQUET

"From the first day of your marriage until the last your rule must be: 'Receive one another...to the praise of God.'


