


REV. TIMOTHY LEHMANN, D.D.






Varieties of Work


SAINT PAUL, writing to the Christians at Corinth, reminded them that there "are varieties of gifts . . . of service . . . of working" within the church. He lists a few examples: people with brilliant intellects, with gifts of healing, able to work miracles; prophets; interpreters of tongues.

A few of these gifts are being neglected by the church today. Others are being used exclusively by secular organizations or individuals. Many of them can be recognized in modern dress—the prophets are our preachers or forthtellers; those of intellectual brilliance are our church college and seminary professors; the interpreters of tongues are the translators who have put the Bible into more than a thousand tongues.

Paul's list was not meant to be exhaustive. There are many examples which can be added, especially in our complicated, modern age. There are the church school teachers and officers, of course; the organists and choir singers; acolytes and ushers; altar guild members and office secretaries; writers, editors and publishers; evangelism visitors and church treasurers; councilmen and welfare workers; church architects and sextons; et cetera; et cetera; et cetera!

"Varieties" is a most appropriate word. No one person has the ability to do everything. No person need feel that he can do nothing. Every variety of work is important. "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good," writes Paul.

What gift have you been given? Are you using it for Christ?

Lutherans have found that the summer months are good ones for discovering, training and inspiring church leaders. Camps and summer assemblies conducted by the church have proved to be among the most effective ways of doing this.

Attendance at such gatherings has been increasing steadily. In 1959 the United Lutheran Church alone had 72 camps and summer schools with an attendance of 30,852 campers and 3,106 staff members.



Of course, many campers attend for the recreation and social fellowship which are a part of every camp. Softball, volley ball, hiking, swimming and other forms of physical exertion are attractive. Weiner roasts, song-fests, stunt nights, treasure hunts offer opportunities for social fellowship in a Christian atmosphere.



Study is a part of most camp programs, too. Courses dealing with the Bible, the teachings of the church, methods of teaching in church schools,


training in churchmanship, and the development of new skills are offered. Many a camper who has come only for recreation has found the "work" as enjoyable as the play.



Since these camps are sponsored by the church there is no apology for an emphasis on worship. Private devotions are encouraged and each person urged to continue in such private worship throughout life. Hillside, "sunset," or rustic chapel group worship is popular. Not only are there inspiring speakers but the campers share in the leadership of such meetings. Small cabin groups usually worship together before the lights go out for the night.



What are the results? Are they good? Ask the camp directors, or the pastors who have encouraged their members to attend these summer schools. Ask the campers, or, better yet, attend a camp or summer school and see for yourself.

"HOW TO GO TO CHURCH"

(Ten Rules for Getting Results from Church Going)

FIRST: Go regularly to church. A prescription ordered by a physician to be taken at regular intervals is not effective if taken once a year.

THIRD: Spend a quiet Saturday evening and get a good sleep. Get in condition for Sunday.

FOURTH: Go in a relaxed state of body and mind. Don't rush to church. Go in a leisurely manner. The absence of tension is a requisite to successful worship.

FIFTH: Go with the expectation of enjoyment. Church is not a gloomy place. Christianity is a radiant and happy way of living.


SIXTH: Sit relaxed in the pew, feet on floor, hands loosely in lap or at side. Allow the body to yield to the contour of the pew. Don't sit rigid. God's power cannot reach your personality through a tied-up body and mind.

SEVENTH: Come expecting to get your problem solved in church. Think hard during the week, but let the problem "simmer" in the mind on Sunday. In church conceive of God's peace as quieting your thoughts to permit insights from the depths to come to the surface of your mind.

EIGHTH: In church drop all ill will. Grudges block the flow of spiritual power. To cast out ill will pray in church for those against whom you feel resentful.

NINTH: Practice the art of meditation. Think of some beautiful scene, perhaps even your favorite trout stream. Then fix your mind on Christ. Think about God. This will tend to bring peace and refreshment.

TENTH: Go to church expecting some great and exciting thing to happen to you. Every Sunday some people's lives become thrillingly different. It can happen to you.


