THE QUESTION - "WHY OBSERVE LENT?"

is often asked by persons whose churches do not observe this season. If we were asked for an answer, would we be able to adequately reply? Those who are informed know that Lent is nothing new that should need explaining. It is as old as today's text; Jesus announces that he is going to Jerusalem to suffer and die. That period going toward Holy Week and Good Friday is Lent. From the very beginning of Christianity, Lent has been observed. At first the apostles put aside forty hours before Easter to prepare spiritually for Easter. Later that period was considered insufficient and the time was lengthened to seven days before Easter, known as Holy Week. As years went by people felt the need of more time for spiritual preparation for Easter and the period was lengthened to forty days at the Council of Nicea, 325 A.D, the Church officially set aside forty days of preparation by fasting and repentance. Note it was 325 A.M. and not 1325. Through the centuries, millions of Christians have found it helpful to spend 40 days of Lent as necessary preparation for a meaningful Easter.

SUGGESTIONS ABOUT CHURCH WEDDINGS

Those who contemplate marriage are:

To consult the minister well in advance of the wedding about the time.

No announcements of a wedding should be made without such consultation with the Pastor, who wishes to interview each couple about the importance of marriage.

Such arrangements should include date, place, time of day, the music to be used and the decorations to be placed in the Church.

A Wedding is a religious ceremony and very sacred and only the highest type music and songs should be used. The pastor and the organist should be asked about this.

Everything in connection with the wedding should be done in the spirit of reverence, also by those attending the Wedding.

Rice or confetti should never be taken into or thrown in the Church or in the Narthex.

No Pictures are to be taken during the marriage ceremony. If pictures are taken later enough time should be allowed for the next appointment to follow.
