

#### ABOUT THE COVER

Pictured in the woodcut on this cover are the symbols of the Holy Communion, the wafer and the chalice, which recall the words of Christ, "This is my body; this is my blood." The letters "ihs" on the chalice are the first three letters of the Greek spelling of Jesus. Along with the wafer and the chalice we see the wheat and the grapes, natural foods, which are transformed into the Communion elements, spiritual food. The wheat and grapes also call to mind Christ's witness to the believers, "I am the vine," and "I am the bread of life." Thus the total design defines the believer's Communion relationship with his Christ.



### ABOUT THE COVER:

With the exception of the cross, the fish is credited with being the oldest symbol  
in Christendom. The Greek word for fish is IXOUS (pronounced ikthus). The early  
Christians turned it into an acrostic that worked out as follows:

I - IHSUS	(Pronounced	Yasoo)	Jeſus
X - XPISTOS	( "	Kristos)	Christ
O - OEOS	( "	Thee-os)	God('s)
U - UIOS	( "	Wee-os)	Son
S - SOTR	( "	So-tare)	Savior

This was used as a code to identify Christians during the time of the Roman persecutions.  
However, instead of saying the Greek word, they usually drew a simple fish. Today it  
reminds us always of the words of Christ, "Blessed are they who are persecuted for  
righteousness' sake, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."


We look for good attendance for the month of August when the Pastor's brother will possibly conduct his last summer services at our Church.

He judges men and nations by his righteous will declared through prophets and apostles.



IN NATIVITATEM DOMINI NOSTRI JESU CHRISTI CANTICUM  
(SONG OF THE BIRTH OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST)  
Marc-Antoine Charpentier 1634-1704

The oratorio is typical of Charpentiers music in  
its combination of Italian and French traits. The  
work is partly in the tradition of the Biblical  
oratorios of Carissimi and Giovanni Francesco  
Anerio. These composers were comparatively respect-  
ful of the eloquently simple prose of the Latin  
Vulgate Bible, adding dialogue or other elaborative  
text only sparingly. Except for the lovely opening  
sentence - which sets the scene, as it were - and  
the final "artless but devout song" of the shepherds,  
Charpentier's text is quite faithful to Luke 2:8-16.

We cannot say precisely when the work was com-  
posed, as the manuscript is not dated, and the work  
was not published before this year, 1959. Since the  
work was written for the private chapel of the  
Duchesse de Guise, and Charpentier was employed by  
her in the mid 1650's we can be certain that In  
Nativitatem D. N. J. C. Canticum was composed between  
1655 and 1688, the time of the Duchesse's death.


