

## John W. Ziegler

Services for John W. Ziegler, a retired millwright, will be held at 11:30 a.m. tomorrow at the Duda-Ruck funeral establishment, 7922 Wise avenue in Dundalk.

Mr. Ziegler, who was 67 and lived in the 100 block South Bouldin street, died Sunday at City Hospitals after a short illness.

He retired in 1976 after working for five years as a millwright, installing machinery for contractors. He worked through the hiring hall of Local 1548 of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America.

A member of the Carpenters Union since 1953, he worked as a construction carpenter through the hiring hall of Local 101 before becoming a millwright.

Earlier, he drove and owned a G.I. Veterans Taxicab while he studied and did heating and refrigeration maintenance work.

Before enlisting in the Army in 1942, he served in the Civilian Conservation Corps in the Blue Ridge Mountains in Virginia. He joined the CCC in 1939.

He is survived by his wife, the former Mary R. Wagner; four daughters, Jackie L. Ziegler and Phyllis A. Ziegler, both of Baltimore, Terry M. Ziegler, of Randallstown, and Debra Gaydos, of Dundalk; three sons, Perry J. Ziegler and John W. Ziegler, Jr., both of Essex, and Louis E. Ziegler, of Staunton, Va.; a sister, Pearl Singer, of Rosedale, and ten grandchildren.
