Services for Charles H. Funk, Sr., a retired foreman at the Maryland Shipbuilding & Drydock Company, will be held at 11.30 A.M. tomorrow at the Moran funeral establishment, Baltimore and Potomac streets.

Mr. Funk, who was 81, died Sunday of lung cancer at the Randallstown Nursing Home.

Born and raised in Canton, Mr. Funk worked at Maryland Drydock for 40 years and was a foreman in the coppersmith shop before his retirement in 1962.
