Mr Getz was instructed to find out just what sort of a meeting this was to be and whether or not it would interfere with the choir which meets on the same night.

Miss Barbara Saklman and Miss May Becker were again appointed to serve as a committee for city hospital work.

On motion by Mr. Drummelhausen and seconded by Mr. Jones, that we again send out special Lenten envelopes with our Lenten service programs was carried.

Mr. Waters, who had been elected by the congregation to investigate conditions surrounding Mr. Missel reported that Mr. Missel owned no property what-so-ever, except the house in which he lives. His only income was 233.26 annually from some bonds. for example

On Motion by Mr. Drummelhausen and seconded by Mr. Jones that we continue to pay Mr. Missel 5.00 per week until next congregational meeting was carried. The committee being dismissed with a vote of thanks.

Mr George Trautner, chairman of pulpit committee was present and presented all correspondence between the said committee and Rev. Lehman to the board. One particular letter dated Jan. 19-1934 was read and ordered answered by the secretary.

Motion by Mr. Drummelhausen and seconded by Mr. Conrad to donate \$10.00 to Federation of Churches was carried.

Motion by Mr. Williams & seconded by Mr. Conrad that confirmation be post-poned until pentecost Sunday so that Rev. Lehman can officiate was carried. This was ordered because the parents of the children requested the same.

Motion by Mr. Getz and seconded by Mr. Metzger that Mr. Wm Single who did such a good job of advertising our both anniversary be appointed chairman of publicity committee was carried.

Board of Trustees inspected parsonage and found that entire building needed papering and paint work needed cleaning. Bids were ordered ^{to be placed} ~~paid~~ made for all work done.
~~On~~ Motion by Mr. Williams and seconded by Mr. Drummelhausen that Ladies' Aid officer be asked to select paper for parsonage. was carried.

At this time (9.30 P.M.) our President Mr Mueller arrived and took charge of the meeting.

Mrs. Lena Nalley requested the use of the church and hall for the morning and afternoon of March 14 for a convention meeting. Motion by Mr. Getz and seconded by Mr. William same be granted was carried.

Mr. Milton Sahlman requested that several benches in the church be reserved some time in March for the boys' brigade. Motion by Mr. Buechler and seconded by Mr. Single the request be granted was carried.

Upon complaint of several members of the board over the fact that Mr. Winkler kept members of the Sunday School outside and would not permit them to enter causing confusion in the vestibule of the church, a committee of three consisting of Messrs. Mueller, Buschler and Williams was appointed to instruct Mr. Winkler that this practice must be stopped for the benefit of everybody concerned.

Mr. Getz, briefly gave an outline of the entire cost of rebuilding and repairing the parsonage porch and various other work on the building. The total cost was \$283.80.

Nothing else claiming the attention of the board, the same adjourned with the repeating in unison of the Lord's Prayer.
