Pastor's Message



*"Greetings favored one!
The Lord is with you."
Luke 1:28*

The other day I heard someone chronicling events that had happened during the 1990's, and I was struck by how long ago the 1990's felt to me, realizing we are about to enter the year 2007! All of the millennialism which surrounded Y2K seems like ancient history, as we have become well acclimated to the 2000's, accustomed to living in a new century.

As we look ahead to these next two months and anticipate the coming of another year

we also encounter time in a different manner with Christmas. The Bible uses two different Greek words to talk about time. Chronos is the Greek word that is used when referring to the measurement of time, such as months or years. Kairos is the word that is used to speak of time which is set apart as special. The moment which is right, or opportunity, is kairos time.

I'm sure everyone has experienced a kairos moment. Perhaps it was the first time you laid eyes on the one you would marry. Perhaps it was at the birth of your child, or perhaps it was at the moment of death of a loved one. These kairos moments eclipse chronos time, they are as we say timeless. for they are moments when God breaks into our existence and connects us to that which is eternal.

The scripture tells us that Mary's kairos moment in the birth of her son Jesus, was not something which she alone experienced. It was a kairos moment for shepherds in a field and for kings in a distant land. Even today Mary's kairos

moment continues to

break into peoples' lives in unexpected and unforeseen ways, revealing the joy of Christmas.

Christmas brings to the forefront of our awareness the fact that "Every hour (chronos) is pregnant with the possibilities for God's kingdom to break in with transforming significance (kairos)." Believing this is the excitement which surrounds Christ's birth.



As in the past, we will be purchasing gifts for 15 children at Hoffman Homes. Gifts will be displayed, and cash donations will be accepted to help with the expense.





United in Christ

As we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the United Church of Christ, we recall with pride our ecumenical commitment to work for the day when, as Jesus prayed, "they may all be one." This great hope, expressed in John 17:21, is central to the UCC's identity—and so the phrase appears on the church's symbol. Itself a union of several Christian traditions, the UCC is actively engaged in relationships with other churches, seeking to heal the broken unity of the Body of Christ.

We can learn much from the spiritual traditions of other churches, and together we serve the world more effectively in God's name. While we are proud of the diversity of the Protestant traditions that have joined in our united church, there is an even greater diversity in the Body of Christ that can make us whole. This is not easy work. As was stated by the UCC's General Synod IX in 1973, our task "is to work in effective mission to heal dehumanizing divisions and to realize more fully the universal human community which is proclaimed in the reality and the hope of the Kingdom of God."

Our ecumenical commitments are as near as the neighboring church down the street and as far as the communities of Christians who live the Gospel in the poorest countries of Africa and Asia, the Pacific and the Americas. We recognize Ecumenical Sunday on January 21, and in the face of divisions between people both near and far, we pray for understanding, welcome and healing.

Points to Ponder...

Christmas Dinner Prayer - The Reason

Christmas dinner prayer, choral concerts, and candle-lit services fill the schedule for modern Christmas celebrations. Prayer helps us communicate with God and as we sit down to eat Christmas dinner, we want to acknowledge the birth of Jesus. While no single official Christmas prayer or psalm exists, we encourage you to think about what Jesus means to you and your family. Speak from your heart to God in Heaven. Here is a sample:

"Heavenly Father, Thank you for sending Your Son Jesus to earth. We not only celebrate His birth in the manger, but also the reason for His coming -- His death on the cross. We thank You for providing eternal life for each person who will accept His free gift of salvation. "Father, I thank you for my family. Life is not always easy for us, but we know that You are always with us. As Your Word says, You will never leave us nor forsake us. Thank you for the love that holds us together and for always meeting our needs. Draw us closer together through this coming year. We love You and want our time of celebration to be memorable today. In Jesus' name. amen."

Some prayers may be verbally spoken, while others might be in the form of psalms (songs of praise and worship). In celebrating Christmas, prayers give praise for the virgin birth of the Son of God, Jesus Christ. Perhaps the first prayer of praise for the birth of Jesus came from His expectant mother, Mary:

"Oh, how I praise the Lord. How I rejoice in God my Savior! For He took notice of His lowly servant girl, and now generation after generation will call me blessed. For He, the Mighty One, is holy, and He has done great things for me. His mercy goes on from generation to generation, to all who fear Him. His mighty arm does tremendous things! How He scatters the proud and haughty ones! He has taken princes from their thrones and exalted the lowly. He has satisfied the hungry with good things and sent the rich away with empty hands. And how He has helped His servant Israel! He has not forgotten His promise to be merciful. For He promised our ancestors -- Abraham and His children -- to be merciful to them forever." Luke 1:46-55.

Mary directed glory to God for His gift to the world through her. Her words of praise have often been sung in choral music and hymns.

Oh Holy night! The stars are brightly shining,
It is the night of the dear Savior's birth
Long lay the world in sin and error pining,
Till he appeared and the soul felt its worth.
A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices,

Oh night divine, Oh night divine.



Christian Fiction Review



Scoop

Scoop opens with an absolutely terrible pun... and it's all downhill from there. Well, I suppose that depends on how you describe "downhill." If you're talking about quality, humor and enjoyment, then this book goes steadily uphill. Fans of Rene Gutteridge's *Boo* series can rest easy. Even though she seems to have moved away from the tales of Skary, Indiana, she's found a new venue (and series!) that will more than delight the readers she's attracted with her previous works.

Hayden Hazard is the central protagonist of *Scoop*, and she's but one of a large brood of home schooled kids who are all grown up and are venturing out into the world to find their way. The thing is - they're not only leaving home school, they're leaving the family business where they've all worked until the untimely death of their parents. And that business was clowning around. No, seriously. They were clowns.

Now Hayden is assistant to Channel 7 news producer Hugo Talley, who is slowly losing his grip on the newsroom and the eccentric cast of characters that inhabit it. I won't go into details on each one, but these people would certainly give the cast of *Boo* (or any other book, for that matter) a run for their money in hilarious eccentricities. The mystery behind some major news stories propels the plot along as a vehicle for these characters to show themselves and their foibles.

At the same time, *Scoop* portrays a thoughtful look at what happens when someone with no qualms whatsoever about their faith (and sharing it) walks into the modern workplace. There's lots of criticism of home schooling on the basis of social interaction, but this helps put some of those to rest, while raising lots of questions about our society in general.

This is one of those great books that improves with the second reading and deserves being read out loud to a significant other who can laugh and cry along with you. **Highly Recommended.**

The Journey Goes On Forever and Ever

Our journey with Christ does not end in a specific destination; it always continues in yet another direction. The spiritual journey is about taking a step, even when we are unsure where that will take us. An Hasid story asks the question, "When did the Red Sea part?" According to the Jewish storyteller, the waters separated not when Moses commanded them, not when he waved his staff over the waters. The waters parted when Moses put his feet in.

Faith is a journey that is often formed in our weakness. So it is right that we seek safe places to ask questions that lead us forward...questions about death, about life, about Jesus, about tragedy and pain.

This concept of journey as an on-going process was beautifully captured in a prayer attributed to Martin Luther sometime in the 16th Century:

*This life is not one of righteousness,
but growth in righteousness.....
Not health, but becoming...not rest but exercise.
We are not yet what we should be, but we are
growing toward it.
The process is not yet finished but it is going on.
This is not the end, but this is the road.
Everything does not yet gleam in glory, but every-
thing is in the process of being purified. Amen.*


