

Because Lent and Easter are early this year, this issue of the United Endeavor includes materials for your use during that entire season. As usual, we provide a coin folder to assist with your self-denial process of stewardship.

Lent begins on Wednesday, February 8, and our traditional style of Wednesday Evening Services will happen again this year with bake sales and a family Fellowship Hour following our worship together. And since during the past two years we have centered our attention upon the Gospel of Mark and the Gospel of Luke to assist with our devotional life and educational growth, this year I have chosen the Gospel of John from which to develop our 1978 Lenten Series. As before, we will follow the gospel writer's own sequence of events in Jesus' life as we are led toward Holy Week and Easter. And again, this series will be coordinated with our worship and sermons on the Sundays during Lent. To get the full effect of this total planning, it will be to your best advantage to attend all the services, Wednesdays and Sundays. That is certainly what is expected of all members of the Confirmation Classes and their parents.

As we move together through a study and devotional process led by the writer of the Fourth Gospel, we should be aware of its uniqueness among the biblical accounts of the life and ministry of Jesus. Reading each of the chapters or passages at least twice before coming to worship would help you in your understanding as you prepare yourself for a very significant devotional experience. Then, you will be better equipped to the real message of this writer of good news. Pastor Hengen

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT

The January meeting of the Church Council was held on Tuesday, January 3. At that time, Council President George Tuerk, Jr. presented the committee assignments for 1973. While these are Council committees, a special effort has been made this year to include members from the congregation at large. Each committee is chaired by a member of the Council, and it is anticipated that each committee will meet at least quarterly. Records of committee proceedings will be kept in notebooks purchased for that purpose.

The Council decided to recommend a change in our By-Laws to allow congregational meetings to be held on a Sunday. The congregation was to vote on this proposed change at the meeting scheduled for January 27. Also at that time, the congregation was to vote on the update of the goals and objectives developed by the Christian Education Committee and recommended by the Council at its January meeting.

The Council expresses thanks to Mrs. Marie Voelker for her services to our church. She has resigned from her Council seat due to ill health. The Council President has appointed Henry Schneider, Jr. to serve for the remainder of Mrs. Voelker's term.

INTERIOR CHURCH RENOVATION FUND

At the November Congregational Meeting, it was decided that the time had finally come to reupholster our worn-out pews. It was also decided that the sanctuary should be repainted. The estimated cost of these repairs is \$5,000. for each - a total of \$10,000. According to the motion made at the meeting, the necessary funds will be withdrawn from the Memorial Fund so that the work may begin as soon as practicable. A challenge fund - the "Interior Church Renovation Fund" - is to be established to repay the money. If this fund is to succeed, everyone must help. This may be done through regular generous contributions in the Improvement Fund Envelopes in your offering box. While these contributions are necessary and appreciated, if they provide our only income, the fund will need several years to reach its goal. Therefore, each member and/or member family is being asked to make a special gift in the special fund envelope. In return, all contributors' names will appear in an Honor Roll Booklet published at the conclusion of the drive. Those who give \$50.00 or more (and we hope this will be you!) will additionally receive a special certificate.

The people of our congregation have never failed to respond to any need of the church. We hope this pattern will continue, so that the Interior Church Renovation Fund may be brought to a successful & speedy conclusion.





