JUBILEE CAMPOREE BULLETIN NO. 450 YEARS OF
SCOUTING

This is the final Bulletin before the Jubilee Camporee. Present estimated attendance of 5003 Boy Scouts and 785 Leaders indicates this will be a real outstanding Golden Jubilee Year celebration.

Facts About The Jubilee Camporee

1. Size of each Troop site will be 60' x 60' for each Troop of 24 Boy Scouts or less - for Troops with more than 24 - additional space will be provided.
2. Camporee registration fee - \$.50 for each Boy Scout and Leader in attendance.
3. Awards - a National Jubilee Camporee Patch will be issued to each Boy Scout and Leader who meets the minimum time requirements for attendance at the Camporee and has paid the \$.50 registration fee.
4. Minimum time at Camporee to be eligible for Awards - at least 30 hours - 15 of which must be on Saturday July 23 and must include overnight.
5. Troops camping at Broad Creek may check out Friday July 22 after 12 noon.
6. Troops due to enter Broad Creek Saturday July 23 may check in Sunday July 24 to 8:00 P.M.
7. Opportunity for confessions for Scouts of the Catholic Faith at nearby Churches.
8. District Camping Chairmen should check with District Activities chairmen on Program Events.
9. Council Jubilee Camporee Committee will provide opening and closing ceremonies, Religious Services, Campfire Program, Camporee Site (water, latrines, garbage and trash removal), General Headquarters, Conservation, County Fair, Wildlife and Forestry Exhibits, Trading Posts and First Aid Stations.
10. This could be the largest Camporee in the history of the Council - with your help it can be.

WATER

Water will be within a reasonable distance of your camp site. Let's be careful in using it. Remember that we are not only guests of the city but also putting an extra drain on an already overtaxed water system. And besides we NEVER WASTE WATER wherever we are.

Water at the fire hydrants will be turned off from 11 P.M. Friday night until 6A.M. Saturday morning and again on Saturday night at the same time. However, water from all other sources, (except fire hydrants), will be available at all times.

REGISTRATION

Attached is your Troop Registration Sheet. Have it completed when you reach the Jubilee Camporee and turn it in, with registration fees, to your District Registrar at District Headquarters when you check in for your camp site. Participation emblems will be issued at the rate of one per paid registration. A Camporee Schedule will be given you at time of check-in and registration.

TRADING POST HOURS:

Friday 3 P.M. - 9 P.M.
Saturday 9 A.M. - 11 A.M. (For milk & bread and Charcoal 11 - 12)
1 P.M. - 2:30 P.M.
4 P.M. - 9:30 P.M.
Sunday 10 A.M. - 3 P.M.

There will be a stand located at Harfor Rd. and Chesterfield Ave. Rd's which will sell light lunches to visitors this is not operated by the Council and is only for the convenience of visitors and Adult Scouters.

SPECIAL NEWSPAPER

There will be a Special 9 Star issue of the Baltimore News-Post, on sale at 4 P.M. Saturday July 23rd (5¢ a copy) which will carry the Camporee Story on the Front Page and a full page of Camporee pictures on the last page. Please pass this information on to your boys as we are sure that they will want to keep this Special issue. They will also be sold to visitors at the campfire on a first come first served basis.

CAMPOREE T.V. SHOWS

WMAR-TV channel 2 will televise the Camporee at 2:30 P.M. on Saturday July 23rd. Included in 1 hour T.V. Show which will come live from the Camporee Will be Special Cub & Explorer film sequences.

CAMPOREE SANITATION

Attached is a sheet on camp sanitation. Please observe sanitary rules concerning dishwashing, garbage disposal and anything which might affect the cleanliness or health of your camp. There will be containers provided for disposal of garbage.

PARKING AND TAFFIC PLAN

The moving in and out of about 6000 people on Friday afternoon and Sunday morning can be a real problem unless you follow carefully the plan for "Traffic and Parking". Please review it with those who are going to help you get to and from the Jubilee Camporee. Stickers, as indicated in the plan, are enclosed. Place them on the top center of the windshield.

Now get your map, (attached to this Bulletin), and review how it is to be done. To avoid traffic conjection, the following traffic, parking and unloading plan will be in effect.

TRAFFIC - All traffic on Chesterfield Ave. will move west (Belair to Harford Rds) all traffic will move east, via Eastwood Drive on Parkside Drive (Harford to Belair Rd)

UNLOADING - Carroll & Eastern Districts drive east on Parkside Drive and Eastwood Dr.

Unload at area B. Drive east to Prior Ave. Via Greenbrier Drive and park in area

4. (Blue) Arrowhead & Harford Districts - unload at Area E on Chesterfield Ave.

then move into parking area 2 (Green) Old Glory Southern Districts - unload

Old Glory - Southern Districts - unload on Chesterfield Ave (Area F) and carry

in equipment when possible. Trucked equipment come into park area (by Park Rd.

G) unload at Headquarters Area. (H) and move into parking Area 2 (Green)

Loch Raven District - come into Park area (by Park Road G), unload at headquar-

ters area (H) and move immediately in to parking Area 2 (Green).

PARKING STICKERS - Area 1 - One yellow parking sticker for each Scoutmaster.

Area 2 - One Green parking sticker per 5 Scouts registered in unit
(North side of Lake Montabellow, (all Districts except Eastern and Carroll))

Area 3 - one Organe parking sticker for each 5 Explorer Scouts
registered (Explorer Activities only)

Area 4 - Eastern & Carroll parking only, one Blue parking sticker
for each 5 Scout registered.

No Parking allowed on Chesterfield Ave. or in Park (Except in approved area 1-3-4) other parking subject to park and city police regulations and fines - unload and move on immediately.

VISITOR & PUBLIC PARKING south side of Lake Montebello and on side streets. In checking out carry equipment to your car. Get out of area as soon as possible.
